Dear Sisters,

Loving greetings from Provincial House, Dum Dum!

I wish you a very Happy Easter filled with the peace, joy and love of the Risen Lord. May the Easter celebration bring new life and vigour to our communities and the educative apostolate. The greeting of the Risen Christ to his disciples on the evening of Easter, "Peace be with you!" (Jn. 20:19), continues to resound in us all. The feast of the Divine Mercy



"I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day, the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet." (Diary 699)

The first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be deeds of mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to our neighbours always and everywhere. You must not shrink from this or try to absolve yourself from it. (*Diary 742*) As we celebrate the feast of Divine Mercy let us learn from Jesus to become merciful in our dealing with one another so we can be the worthy children of the Merciful Father.
