At Christmas Jesus brings us spiritual energy, an energy which help us in our day today life, that transform our heart so that we can encounter Christ. Our Chapter document invites us to do the same. "Even today, an encounter with Jesus offers us new vision, opens our eyes, changes our hearts and our minds. Only a true encounter with Him transforms us from within and helps us to- re- read reality with new eyes. The resulting change becomes a power that transforms a source of vocational and missionary fruitfulness". (GC XXIII) Hence, let our Christmas celebration be a moment of encounter with God Himself who has pitched His tent in the heart of each one of us.

Christmas! It is a time of joy. The joyful announcement of the angels to the shepherds in Bethlehem rings out everywhere: But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will bring great joy for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord". (Luke 2:10 -11) The joy of Jesus' birth has the power to transform the difficulties of life. Mary and Joseph were forced by the Roman authorities to make an unreasonably-difficult, journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem. In spite of their difficult circumstances, they were overjoyed at the birth of Jesus. The shepherds were shivering in the frosty winter air, overworked, tired. Notwithstanding their dejected predicament, they went in haste to Mary and Joseph and the infant lying in the manger, and they returned hearts filled with joy. The magi travelled a distant land. Despite their difficult journey, they were overjoyed at seeing babe with his mother Mary. May the birth of Jesus help us to experience the same joy that was experienced by the angels, Mary and Joseph, the shepherds, and the magi. May the Jesus, the PRINCE OF PEACE bless us with the gif of peace in our hearts, in our communities, in our homes, in our country and in the world.

# 51st World Day of Peace - 1st January 2018

The theme for Pope Francis' Annual World Day of Peace message for 2018 is: "Migrants and Refugees: Men and Women in Search of Peace". Pope points out what is needed in order for migrants and refugees to find the peace they seek is a strategy combining four actions: welcoming, protecting, promoting and integrating.
