Following these two family events, we had the post-chapter journey evaluation at provincial level. They were truly days of gratitude to the Lord for the journey already made in realizing the choices undertaken. Mother General in her Circular letter dated 24th January stated that 'The Evaluation is an opportunity that the Institute offers us to revive the consciousness of our charismatic identity, to re-read the life in the light of the Word of God and the challenges of today and to project towards the future with hope."

Thank you for the support of your prayers and for the contributions you made towards its success. The sharing on the three pastoral choices and our experiences of the renewed Constitutions and Regulations at a deeper level was an opportunity for all the participants to re-commit ourselves to an encounter that forms and transforms leading us to be missionaries of hope and joy wherever we are and in whatever we do. I am sure the Animators and the Sisters who participated in the Assembly have communicated to you their rich experiences, the prayer moments, the sessions and also the suggestions for the betterment of our personal, community and apostolic life. Yes, dear Sisters, every sincere encounter with Jesus changes lives, He changes our life purpose, He changes us from being faithless to being faithful, and He gives us unconditional love and uncompromising hope of everlasting life.

TRANSFORMATION THROUGH ENCOUNTER

For our monthly appointment of this month, I would like to share with you some reflections on the first choice of Pastoral conversion: *Transformation through Encounter*. "The most important thing that can happen to a person is to encounter Jesus, who loves us, who has saved us, who gave his life for us", says Pope Francis. Where then, and how, do we encounter Jesus each day, an encounter bound to change our lives and make us happy and joyful? I would like to propose for our consideration, three places to encounter the living Jesus: First, Jesus is alive in his **Word**, the inspired Gospel stories and the living tradition of the church. Second, we meet Jesus in the **Sacraments**, especially in regular participation in both the Eucharist and the sacrament of Reconciliation. And third, we meet Jesus in our loving **Service** to the young people, to those in need, those who live on the periphery of society.

In these three ways we meet and encounter Jesus. To meet Jesus and be transformed by that encounter is the hope and joy of every person who is searching for God. Therefore, the importance of meeting Him in our daily life, through Word of God, in the celebration of the Eucharist, in our community prayers and above all, a personal encounter in the stillness of our being, a time alone with the Alone, cultivating a great desire, and a hunger and thirst for God and for spirituality. The Chapter Document says, "As FMA, taking charge of our own spiritual growth on the journey of following Jesus is a necessary condition so that all the experiences of life can become opportunities for growth as missionary disciples." (GC XXIII p. 25)

Both personally and as a community, we are called to seek the plan of God together to celebrate the" mysticism of meeting "in everyday life and joyfully witness to our faith experience. Only an encounter with Jesus can transform our personal life and that of our communities into a home that welcomes, eases suffering, invites toward new horizons, and evangelizes. A relationship that expresses the happiness in being FMA called to a stupendous and real mission among the young.

As Pope Francis remind us that every institutional renewal will be efficacious only and exclusively if it is actualized by 'renewed' people, capable of conversion and on-going purification, in a change of mentality and of life. Let us be convinced that without having a vital, personal and solid relationship with Christ we will not be able to do anything. The more we are in intimacy with God the more we will be united among ourselves and will be able to accomplish much in our mission among the young.

FMA Missionary Expedition 140th Anniversary





After an intense year of preparation, animated and guided by the Mission sector, Rome, the celebration of the 140th anniversary of the first FMA missionary expedition to Uruguay will take place in the whole Institute on 14 November 2017. We owe a huge debt of gratitude to our dear Sr. Alaide Deretti, the General councilor for the Missions, for her monthly letter which prepared us so beautifully to celebrate this great event of our Institute in a fitting manner at personal and community level.

Through a gift of the Holy Spirit and a significant intuition of Don Bosco, after about five years since the foundation of the FMA Institute, he opened the mission *ad gentes*. At Mornese, Mother Mazzarello, the first sisters, and even the students dreamt of going to evangelize the young people in distant lands. To celebrate the 140th anniversary of the first Missionary Expedition is to reaffirm with greater conviction our adhesion to the missionary mandate of Jesus: "Go to the whole world".
