Dearest Sisters,

### Affectionate greetings from Auxilium Provincial House, Dum Dum!

"I have called you by name you are mine" (Isaiah 43:1) I am sure in our hearts and minds the resonance of the above passage and our commitment springs up as we enter into the month of August.

5<sup>th</sup> August is a memorable and meaningful day for each one of us. Let us recall with gratitude Constitutions art. 1, which speaks of God's plan for the institute, correlated with that of Jesus as it reflects in the light of St. John 15:16 " You did not choose me, but I chose you and I appointed you to go and bear fruit and that your fruit will last". My dear sisters, today we live in a challenging time much more than any other times, therefore we are called to renew and relive our Spirit and Charism according to the time and need. This phenomenon of pandemic just like the typhoid of Mornese, reminds us all that it is necessary to go out, to be a presence and a response like that of Main. As we celebrate the Independence Day of our country, let us entrust our leaders and all our brothers and sisters to the protection of Mary our Heavenly Queen and Mother.

My sincere thanks to all of you dear sisters for your selfless commitment to the mission and the enthusiasm with which each of you dedicate yourself to impart education in a holistic way, bringing up the children and the young people in the ways of the Lord.
