Dearest Sisters,

Month of July gives us the key word "My God and my Lord" the profession of faith by the Apostle of India St. Thomas. His character is outlined in the Gospel of St. John. His devotion to Jesus is clearly expressed in the following passages: when Jesus planned to return to Judaea, the disciples warned him of the animosity, to which Thomas soon replied, "Let us also go, that we may die with him." (John 11:5–16). He was a person ready to die for his Master and who understood His worth. This is the fruit of letting oneself to be touched by the Master. At the Last Supper Thomas could not comprehend what Jesus meant when he said, "I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also. And you know the way where I am going. Thomas said to him, Lord we do not know where you are going, how can we know the way? Jesus replied: "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life". To know Jesus Christ is to know both the goal and the way. In the fullest sense He is our way, guide and strength and beside Him there is no other. Christ is the door and it is marked plainly, "Whoever believes in


me shall not perish, but have everlasting life." Jesus alone is the way for us to the Father. "No one comes to the Father, but through me" (John 14:1–7)

World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

On January 31, 2021, Pope Francis announced a new celebration in honour of all grandparents and the elderly, who are so important to our communities, families and the Church. This new World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly will be celebrated every year on the fourth Sunday in July, close to the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus. This year it will be celebrated on Sunday, July 25, 2021.

The Holy Father has instituted the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly because grandparents are often forgotten, and we forget this wealth of preserving roots and passing on what the elderly have received. Pope says, "the elderly remind us that



old age is a gift and that grandparents are the link between the different generations, to pass on to the young the experience of life." The theme chosen by Pope Francis for this occasion is "I am with you always" (Mt 28:20). It expresses the closeness of the Lord and the Church to every older person, especially in these challenging times of the Covid-19 pandemic. It is also a promise of closeness and hope that young and old can mutually share also older person have a mission of evangelization, proclamation and prayer, and of encouraging young people in their faith.
