December is an important month for all of us; it is the season of Advent leading us to the joyous celebration of the Nativity of our Lord and the great feast of the Immaculate Conception of our Blessed Mother.

The Advent Season is all about reflecting on how we can prepare our hearts, homes and communities for Christ's birth. It is a time to revive our faith in the incarnation of Jesus and how He could be born again in our communities and families. We welcome this great event through prayer, reflections and good deeds of sharing and caring to express what the true meaning of Jesus' birth is to everyone.

Traditional Advent wreaths and candles

The wreath and candles are full of symbolism tied to the season of Advent. The wreath itself, which is made of various evergreens, signifies continuous life. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life we find in Christ. The light symbolizes the transformation of oneself from the various types of darkness to the light of Christ.

- 1. The Candle of **Hope** signifies God's people. Hope is like a light shining in a dark place. As we look at the light of this candle, we celebrate the HOPE we have in Jesus.
- 2. The Candle of **Peace** indicates the Old Testament prophets whose life-like light shines in a dark place. As we look at this candle, we celebrate the PEACE we find in Jesus Christ.
- 3. The Candle of **Love p**oints to John the Baptist. He in turn points out to the true light Jesus Christ, the Messiah. As we look at this candle, we celebrate the LOVE we have for Jesus Christ
- 4. The Candle of **Joy** directs us to Mary the mother of Jesus. She is like a candle shining in a dark place that brought forth Jesus to the world. As we look at this candle, we celebrate the JOY we find in Jesus Christ.





The 5th candle represents the **Birth of Jesus Christ.** The flame of this candle reminds us that He is the light of the world and that if we follow Him, we will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of true light.

Hail Mary and the Mission of Don Bosco

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is a feast celebrating Mary's conception without sin. On this day, in the Church of St Francis of Assisi Turin December 8, 1841, a humorous incident opened the way to put into action the project of Don Bosco for the boys, who roamed the streets of the city, especially those released from prison. On the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, when Don Bosco was vesting to celebrate the Mass, Joseph Comotti, the sacristan, seeing a boy in a corner, asked him to serve the Mass. But the boy did not know how to serve the Mass and was completely embarrassed. With this encounter, Don Bosco opened his way to put into action his project. A couple of things are worth perceiving, the sacristan suspecting the boy of being no good drives him out with blows, and Don Bosco intervenes and claims that the boy is his friend. There all it began as we see today, the hundreds and thousands of young people and children in our courtyard. Today, like yesterday young people are looking for the presence of Don Bosco in this contemporary era of fastdeveloping technology. Dear sisters, therefore let us enter into their realities of life and offer hope, love, joy and peace in this great season of Advent as we are preparing ourselves to celebrate Christmas, the feast of love, peace and joy. This is the apt time to make a shift of transformation from carelessness to a diligent and committed life. During this season we are called to be alert and watchful in order to revive our spirit of enthusiasm and zeal for an intimate union with God and learn from Him by sitting at the feet of the Master, Jesus the Good Shepherd, to become more and more having only one aim "Da Mihi Animas Cetera Tolle".
