Dearest and loving Sisters,

Prayerful greetings from Provincial House, Dum Dum!

The month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus. The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pope Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood. "The Precious Blood which we worship is the Blood which the Saviour shed for us on Calvary and reassumed at His glorious Resurrection; it is the Blood which courses through the veins of His risen, glorified, living body seated at the right hand of God the Father in heaven; it is the Blood made present on our altars by the words of Consecration; it is the Blood which merited sanctifying grace for us and through it washes and beautifies our soul and inaugurates the beginning of eternal life in it."

Her daily spontaneous prayer for all the Sisters of the province especially for the provincial might have resounded in every corner of the communities. We thank her for her exemplary life enveloped by the never fading smile on her face which revealed the innocence of her soul. As we continue to pray for the eternal repose of our dear Sr. Rose, let us emulate her fidelity in little things and her love for the Institute and the respect for the superiors, her serenity and calmness, her commitment and total self-giving, her sense of gratitude and delicacy of conscience, her approachability, simplicity and motherliness, above all her deep love for Jesus and Mary. stalwarts are passing away one by one. It's up to us now to take up the challenge and take the Salesian charism forward ever more creatively, as we are about to enter into the next century of FMA presence in India.

By now we have found the depth of our father and founder Don Bosco by going through the articles very closely. Let us also discover the richness of the Word of God that lies in the constitutions. Every aspect of the article has the Word of God that challenges us and calls for a deep commitment and dedication. Let us therefore really be authentic religious according to the desire of our beloved Mother Mazzarello.

The month of June called us to focus on art. 49 of our Constitutions. It radiates all about our living and working together. In the spirit of the family... the Trinitarian aspect... and the new commandment by which we will be known as Jesus' disciples. As we prepare for the renewal of our vows, we could all make an introspection of ourselves and of our communities to see where do we stand in this regard of living and working together...Let us make concrete step for oneself and get back to our origins where everyone thought of pleasing God and doing His holy will alone. Let us really get rid of all our infirmities and renew ourselves with a renewed commitment and enthusiasm.

During this month of July we are challenged by the life of the Apostle of India, St. Thomas, a man who was ready even to go and die with Jesus. Just because of him we are called 'blessed'. He cleared all his doubt. Are we courageous enough to clear all our doubts and go ahead for the Lord and for His kingdom? Are we ready to prepare castles in heaven by giving life to the poor and vulnerable or are we still wrapped in our comfort zones? Let us think seriously and examine ourselves, each one about herself, not about others, and see where do we stand, where is our focus, for whom did I leave everything and followed Jesus?

#### **SAINTS - OUR SPIRITUAL GUIDES**

The saints who have gone ahead of us have lived a life given for others, they were ready to undergo anything for the sake of Christ and His kingdom and thus obtained the joys of everlasting life. Blessed Maria Romero whose feast we celebrate on 7<sup>th</sup> July gave herself entirely to the poorest, living fully the virtue of hope and trusting in Providence. In her tireless work of charity, which led her to start thirty-six festive oratories, social works, homes for homeless families, a clinic for medical assistance to the poor, the virtue of hope did not fail to shine. Despite the trials and difficulties encountered, faithful to the charism of the Founder, St. John Bosco, "she hoped against all hope" (cf. Rom 4:18). Let us imitate her total abandonment

to the love of Jesus and Mary, whom she called her 'King and Queen' and dare to do the impossible for the sake of the poor and the needy.

On 26<sup>th</sup> July as we celebrate the feast of the **Grandparents of God, SS. Joachim and Anne,** we entrust all grandparents and grandchildren to their care and protection. Mary learned from them how to reflect deeply on the Word of God and she absorbed that Word — body, mind, and soul. This feast tells us how important the strong and faithful example of our parents, our first models of faith, is for us.

In the life of **St. Alphonsa** whose feast falls on 28<sup>th</sup> July, there shines the mystery of the cross. Far from considering sufferings and evil to be avoided at all costs, Alphonsa founded in them an effective means of sanctification. She not only accepted without complaint the extra ordinary physical suffering, and even asked more. The greatness of our life does not consist in doing laudable things before the world but leading a saintly life. St. Ignatius of Loyola whose feast we celebrate on 31<sup>st</sup> July on the other hand, teaches us to put Christ and the Church in the centre; to allow ourselves to be conquered by Him in order to serve; to feel the shame of our limitations and our sins, in order to be humble before Him and before the others. The Catholic Church honours these saints because they are believed to be men and women of "heroic virtue", who are considered to be spiritual guides and mentors to us who are still pilgrims on earth.

Dear Sisters, we have become religious, first and foremost to work out our own sanctification and then the salvation of souls. Let us therefore leave aside all our pettiness and live a life worthy of our call, leading a life of heroic virtue, focused on Jesus, Mary and our holy founders and saints. Now is the favorable time for us to renew 'our first yes' seriously and re-commit ourselves to a life of Salesian holiness. Let us entrust each other to Mary our Mother and Teacher so that we be truly authentic "images of Mary" inspiring each other to re-dedicate our lives in the path traced out by our Constitutions. Let us pray for each other daily and support one another in doing as much good as possible in the Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello way. Wish you all a very Happy Feast of the celebration of our 'yes' on 5 August.
