Solemnity of all the Saints

The feast of all the Saints is of great importance for us because it reminds us of God's call to each of us, to be holy. It is an invitation and a challenge before us to live a life of holiness and to imitate those who have obtained holiness. They show us the path that leads to the Kingdom of God and to happiness: the path of humility, gentleness, compassion, meekness, justice and peace. To be a saint is to walk on this road. Pope Francis says: 'The Solemnity of All Saints is "our" celebration: not because we are good, but because the sanctity of God has touched our life. The Saints are not perfect models, but people through whom God have passed. We can compare them to the Church windows which allow light to enter in different shades of colour. The saints are our brothers and sisters who have welcomed the light of God in their hearts and have passed it on to the world, each according to his or her own "hue". But they were all transparent; they fought to remove the stains and the darkness of sin, so as to enable the gentle light of God to pass through. This is life's purpose: to enable God's light to pass through; it is the purpose of our life too. Winning the victory of heaven is not



always about doing extraordinary things but about following this path every day wherever we are and in whatever we do. Let us live our lives to go marching in to be among the saints.

The Commemoration of all the faithful departed

The Commemoration of all the faithful departed is for all of us an intense moment of faith, prayer and reflection on the "last things" of life. In fact, commemorating all the faithful departed we remember the reality that each one of us has also moved closer to death because it is our common

destiny. From the beginning, the church has honoured the memory of the dead and offered prayers and suffrages for them, so that they may attain the beatific vision of God. This commemoration should encourage us to prepare ourselves for the hour of our death. Let the words of Pope Francis ring in our ears: 'Contemplated in faith, death is a light that illuminates life and a reality that we should always have before us'. Let us remember that we are pilgrims on earth so as to live our lives worthy of our true and eternal home.

Let us spend this month praying for our dear departed sisters, family members, friends and benefactors who have gone ahead of us. "It is, therefore, a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins" (2 Macc. 12: 46). We can particularly help the Poor Souls by offering Mass, providing for charity for the dead, but also relieve their sufferings through our prayers, sufferings and penances.
