The Month of the Holy Rosary

The Rosary is one of the most cherished prayers of our Catholic Church. While we pray the Rosary we are invited to meditate on the saving mysteries of our Lord's life and the faithful witness of our Blessed Mother. Journeying through the Joyful, Sorrowful, Luminuous and Glorious mysteries of the rosary, the individual brings to mind our Lord's incarnation, His passion and death and His resurrection from the dead. In so doing, the rosary assists us in growing in a deeper appreciation of these mysteries, in uniting our life more closely to our Lord and in imploring His graced assistance to live the faith. Archbishop Fulton Sheen said, "The rosary is the book of the blind, where souls see and there enact the greatest drama of love the world has ever known; it is the book of the simple, which initiates them into mysteries and knowledge more satisfying than the education of other men; it is the book of the aged, whose eyes close upon the shadow of this world, and open on the substance of the next. The power of the rosary is beyond description".

The month of the Holy Rosary is a perfect time to remind ourselves of her 15 in-andout-of-this-world promises she made to those who pray the Rosary faithfully. When she makes a promise, it is absolutely 100% true and worthy of belief. I would like to bring to your attention the *Fifteen Promises of Our Lady to those who faithfully pray the Rosary:*

1. Whosoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary shall receive signal graces. 2. I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the Rosary. 3. The Rosary shall be a powerful armor against hell, it will destroy vice, decrease sin and defeat heresies 4. It will cause good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God; it will withdraw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire for Eternal things. Oh, those souls would sanctify themselves by this means. 5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall not perish. 6. Whosoever shall recite the Rosary devoutly, applying himself to the consideration of its Sacred Mysteries, shall not perish by an unprovided death; if he be just he shall remain in the



grace of God, and become worthy of Eternal Life. 7. Whoever shall have a true devotion for the Rosary shall not die without the Sacraments of the Church. 8. Those who are faithful to recite the Rosary shall have during their life and at their death the Light of God and the plenitude of His Graces; at the moment of death they shall participate in the Merits of the Saints in Paradise. 9. I shall deliver from purgatory those who have been devoted to the Rosary. 10. The faithful children of the Rosary shall merit a high degree of Glory in Heaven. 11. You shall obtain all you ask of me by recitation of the Rosary. 12. All those who propagate the Holy Rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities. 13. I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the advocates of the Rosary shall have for intercessors the entire Celestial Court during their life and at the hour of death. 14. All who recite the Rosary are my Sons, and brothers of my Only Son Jesus Christ. 15. Devotion to my Rosary is a great sign of predestination. The Rosary basically was given to St. Dominic to overcome heresy and to promote virtue. Today too we need to overcome many heresies and challenges that we face in the church and in our everyday life. Therefore I would encourage all our communities to be faithful to this great devotion and cultivate the same in our young people and through them reach out to their families.

Feast of St. Teresa of Avíla

Saint Teresa of Ávila (28 March 1515 – 4 October 1582), was a prominent Spanish mystic, Carmelite nun, a great saint and doctor of the Church and an author during the Counter Reformation, and theologian of contemplative life through mental prayer. St. Teresa's great work of reform began with herself. She made a vow always to follow the more perfect course, and resolved to keep the rule as perfectly as she could. Teresa's efforts to reform the convents were oftentimes misunderstood, misjudged and opposed. Yet she struggled on, courageous and faithful; she struggled with her own mediocrity, her illness, her opposition. And in the midst of all this she clung to God in life and in prayer. Toward the end of her life she exclaimed: "Oh, my Lord! How true it is that whoever works for you is paid in troubles! And what a precious price to those who love you if we understand its value! " As we honour St. Teresa, patroness of our Institute let us follow her example of contemplation and action and together with her we may be able to say "Nothing is wanting to the one who possesses God. God alone suffices."

Feast of Blessed Michael Rua

Bl. Michael Rua was born in Turin on June 9, 1873, the youngest of the nine children. He came to the oratory of Don Bosco in 1852. Don Rua was the most faithful, and therefore the most humble and the most valiant of the sons of Don Bosco. He was a constant companion of Bosco on his journeys, and became the Vicar of the Society in 1865. Pope Leo XIII designated him to be Bosco's first successor and confirmed him as Rector Major in 1888. He was true son, disciple, and imitator of Don Bosco. Don Rua was also known for his fatherly approach and thoughtfulness. As the members and communities increased he sent Salesians all over the world, showing special care for the missionary expeditions. He carried out the vision and mission of Don Bosco with a spirit of faithfulness and availability. Like Don Bosco he had the same gentleness, the same humility, same simplicity, the same greatness of soul and same spirit of joy. The greatness of Don Rua can be attributed to his sanctity, his contribution to the growth of Congregation and above all to his having assimilated, institutionalized and globalised as it were the spirit of Don Bosco. His heroic example is a perfect testimony to the Salesian holiness.
